Grading of written comprehensive exams is on a numerical scale of 0=worst to 4=best. Numerical scores need to be assigned by each examiner. The same numerical grading is used for the oral comprehensive exam, with a score of 0 - 4 assigned by each of the members of the examining committee in the oral exam. A student who receives a grade less than 2.0 from an individual examiner may be required by the supervisory committee to take another course or another written question on that general subject and satisfactorily answer it for the staff member and advisory or supervisory committee involved. The final grade of each section of the written and oral portion of the comprehensive examination will be the mathematical average. The overall grade for the comprehensive exams is the numerical average of the written and oral exam scores. A passing grade is 2.2 for each exam.
