## GP-CESU Review and Renewal Update

The Great Plains Cooperative Ecosystem Studies Unit is currently undergoing a five-year review and renewal. The University of Nebraska-Lincoln and its partner institutions submitted a self-assessment with supplemental materials to the CESU Council on January 21.

A final copy of the self-assessment will be

provided to our partner institutions. A review of the unit with recommendations by the Managers Committee was submitted for consideration by the Council on March 11.

External reviews were provided by Dr. Tony Prado of the Upper and Middle Mississippi Valley CESU, and Dr. Diane Debinski of Iowa State University.

We were recently informed that all of the appropriate materials have been received by the CESU Council and they will be considering our renewal. A decision is expected in May.

## NPS Adds Cultural Research Coordinator

Gary Willson, National Park Service Research Coordinator at UNL, has also been serving as acting Research Coordinator for the Upper & Middle Mississippi Valley CESU the past 15 months.

Recently, a new temporary arrangement has been made where Willson will share duties with Dr. Cal Calabrese, Associate Regional Director,

Cultural Resource Stewardship and Partnerships, Midwest Regional Office. Calabrese is acting as the Cultural Research Coordinator for both the GP-CESU and UMMV CESU, while Willson continues as Natural Research Coordinator for both CESUs.

To date, the GP-CESU has funded only a handful of cultural resource projects, Calabrese's

expertise in cultural resource management as well as his academic connection to both host universities enhance the opportunity for development of cultural projects by partner universities.

This is a very exciting development and one that will significantly increase NPS involvement in the Great Plains and Upper and Middle
