## **Recent Extension Programs (2009-13)**

- Internet Center for Wildlife Damage Management. I developed (1996) and supervise the Coordinator of the ICWDM (http://icwdm.org), which is the leading website in the field. The site had 1,002,586 unique visitors from 175 countries in 2013. Knowledge of users increased 0.46 points to a mean of 2.76 (4-pt scale). The Facebook page reached 6,462 in 2013, which is a 3-fold increase over 2012. We hosted 5,719 documents on the Digital Commons and facilitated 392,120 downloads. We conservatively estimate that the website saves \$136 million in resources annually. The Digital Image Library currently contains over 700 downloadable images.
- eXtension Wildlife Damage Management. I initiated (2008) and co-lead the CoP in wildlife damage management. The site featured 527 pages and 433 FAQs that were viewed over 95,000 times in 2013. We collaborated with 4 CoPs and presented a webinar series that included 6 presentations on wildlife damage management.
- Prevention and Control of Wildlife Damage. I am the primary editor for the leading reference book in the field (http://icwdm.org/handbook/index.asp). We conservatively estimate that it saves \$210 million per year in personal property and resources and \$220 million per year in time and labor. I am leading 5 co-editors and over 100 authors in developing the 5th edition, which currently is about 50% complete.
- National Wildlife Control Training Program. I am co-coordinator for the new program that features a 256-page manual, 336-page supplement, and online course. Eighty-eight people enrolled in the course and total sales were over \$20,000 in 2013. The manual and online course were certified by the National Wildlife Control Operators Association. We secured contracts to develop state-specific programs for Alabama, Delaware, Illinois, and South Carolina (\$23,250).
- Nebraska Master Naturalist Program. I am the Program Supervisor for 207 certified Master Naturalists that have contributed 17,640 hours, equating to nearly \$400,000 in conservation value. Volunteers have reached 340,750 people and impacted nearly 10,000 acres in Nebraska.
- Nebraska Outdoor U! Program. I am the Program Supervisor for an online program that promotes outdoor skills with 3,150 participants and an 85% retention rate. We reached nearly 30,000 people through the NOU! Facebook page and we had over 20,000 views (575 hours) on our 10 YouTube videos in 2013.
